2011-2012 Accelerated Reading Program

AR, Accelerated Reading, is a widely used, computerized program that tests reading comprehension. The teachers have established standard and challenge goals for students in grades 2 through 8, and this data is applied toward their reading grades. Achievement of these goals will be celebrated in the individual classrooms. In addition, students will receive bookmarks, books and/or restaurant certificates from the library. Top achievers will have their names posted in the library as well as on the school website. Those students who surpass their challenge goals will have the opportunity to receive raffle tickets for additional prizes. We encourage our students to challenge themselves and explore the many reading opportunities available in both our library and their classroom collections.

Students visit the library each week. They are allowed to check out books as follows:

Kindergarten classes:	1 book for one week
Grades 1 – 3:	2 books for one week
Grades 4 – 8:	2 books for two weeks

If students finish reading and return their books early, they are more than welcome to check out new materials before their scheduled library time. Students also have the option to renew books. Additional books are available for their use from the classroom collections.

"Big Buddy/Little Buddy" Bake Sale: The students will once again join forces with their "buddies" to host a bake sale. **The bake sale will be held to raise money for the auction.** The buddy group that makes the most profit will win a pizza party. We are looking for volunteers to donate bake sale items for their child's grade to be sold. Please have them pre-cut or pre-packaged and on disposable plates/dishes. They will be priced either 25 or 50 cents, unless marked by you. Baked goods should be brought by 9:00 the morning of the bake sale. All items **must be "nut free"** and should be labeled as such. Please refer to the attached sheet for guidelines to making nut free baked items. The bake sales will start at 11:00 and continue through the lunch hour. Families and friends are welcome to support the class. Any leftover goodies will be available for sale at the end of the school day.

HOW TO READ A LABEL for a PEANUT-FREE DIET

Avoid foods that contain peanuts or any of these ingredients:

artificial nuts
beer nuts
peanut oil
goobers
ground nuts
mixed nuts
monkey nuts
nutmeat
nut pieces
peanut
peanut butter
peanut flour

May indicate the presence of peanut protein:

candy (including chocolate candy/chips)
flavoring (including natural and artificial)
marzipan
nougat

Mandelonas are peanuts soaked in almond flavoring.

Arachis oil is peanut oil.

A study showed that unlike other legumes, there is a strong possibility of cross reaction between peanuts and lupine. Sunflower seeds are often produced on equipment shared with peanuts.

HOW TO READ A LABEL for a TREE NUT-FREE DIET

Avoid foods that contain nuts or any of these ingredients:

almonds
artificial nuts

butternut
caponata
cashews
chestnuts
chinquapin
coconut
filberts/hazelnuts
gianduja (a nut mixture found in some chocolate)
ginko nut
hickory nuts
lichee/lychee nut
macadamia nuts
marzipan/almond paste
nan-gai nuts
natural nut extract (i.e., almond, walnut)

nougat
nut butters (i.e., cashew butter)
nut meal
nutmeat
nut oil
nut paste (i.e., almond paste)
nut pieces
pecans (Mashuga Nuts®)
pesto
pili nut
pine nuts
pistachios
praline
sheanut
walnuts

- Mandelonas are peanuts soaked in almond flavoring.
- Mortadella may contain pistachios.
- Natural and artificial flavoring may contain tree nuts.

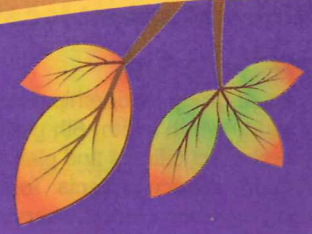

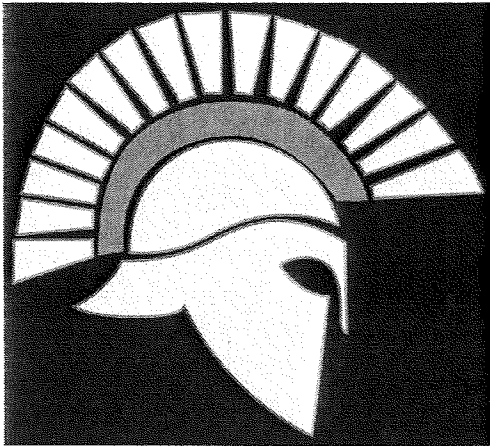
